Our bless-ing - cup is a com - mun-ion with the Blood of Christ.




1. How shall I make a return *to the* **LORD** for all the good he has *done for* **me?**

 3. To you will I offer sacrifice *of thanks-giving,* and I will call upon the name *of the* **LORD.**




1. The cup of salvation I *will take* **up,** and I will call upon the name *of the* **LORD.**

 4. Sweeter al - - so than **syrup** or honey from the **comb**.





 4. Then will I go in to the altar of **God,** the God of my gladness *and* **joy;**






