



2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time


Psalm 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10



Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will.




1. I have waited, waited *for the LORD,* and He stooped toward me and *heard my cry.*

4. I announced your justice in the *vast as-sembly;* I did not restrain my lips, as you, *O LORD, know.*




1. And He put a new song in - *to my mouth,* a hymn *to our God.*

Ps 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10


Bles-sed are the poor in spi - rit; the king - dom of hea - ven is theirs!

5th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Psalm 112:4-5, 6-7, 8-9

Psalm 103:1-2, 3-4, 8, 10, 12-13


The Lord is kind and mer - ci - ful.

 4. As far as the east is *from the west,* so far has he put our transgres - *sions from us.*


1. Bless the LORD, *O my soul;* and forget not *all his benefits.*

8th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Psalm 62: 2-3. 6-7. 8-9
